EPISODES

Episode 1

Having returned to her native region, neurosurgeon Valérie Rossier believes she has run someone over – which seems like a bad omen. From now on, at home and at the hospital, nothing will go according to plan..

Episode 2

Who would have been able to miraculously cure young Lucas? The head nurse surreptitiously keeps a watchful eye on the new doctor. Valérie is troubled: Who are these beings who appear to her, without her being able to decipher their messages? Could she have saved her patient?

Episode 3

The witch of the well, a personage of local legend, appears unbidden in Valérie's nightmares. At the hospital, for the first time, she manages to cure a patient by visualising the patient's family background – which calls into question all of her rationalist beliefs.

Episode 4

Valérie tames her new powers, in secret. But when a patient disappears, all suspicions are focussed on her: will she have to suffer the consequences of the strangeness of her actions?

Episode 5

Valérie falls into the trap that her superior, Professor Wassermann, has set for her. She is tasked with training the new surgical robot, while at the same time confronting new worrisome visions.

Episode 6

Unbeknownst to his mother, young Lucas makes friends with Jacques, a young boy who has been hospitalised for a long time at Clinique du Rosaire. On this particular evening, the snow is freshly fallen, the night is dark, and the witch's well is very close by. Will Lucas manage to find out what his new friend's secret is?

Episode 7

Valérie carries out a crucial surgical procedure, using the robot. Lucas, whom the witch has lured to the dry well, falls into it. Will Valerie and the rescue service arrive in time to save him?

Episode 8

Lucas escapes, but remains in a coma. The entire hospital staff devotes their energy to caring for him. Encouraged by her ancestor, the witch of the well, Valérie decides to use her powers to save her son's life.

STATEMENT FROM RTS

Anomalia, an auteur series

Series after series are produced in French-speaking Switzerland, but by no means do they resemble each other! Each one bears the imprint of its creator, the nature of its producers, the authenticity of their attitudes, and so on.

Above and beyond the plots per se, the subject matter of these scripted series needs to resonate more widely and address the phenomena that characterise today's society. In Anomalia, the past and present collide, in a manner that explores, with all the imagination and artistic freedom of scripted drama, a range of themes: identity, transmission, and above all, heritage, in all senses of the term. The heredity that comes into play here relates to its physiological dimension: In what ways does the present bear traces of the past? In what ways do our present lives contain elements of yesterday?

As can be seen, RTS wishes to provide the public with magnificent original narratives that stand out from international scripted drama: unique TV series that bear the hallmarks of our region, by virtue of their rootedness and landscapes, as well as their casts. The cast of Anomalia bears testimony to this quest for balance between international distribution and talented actors in French-speaking Switzerland who play unexpected roles.

If we wish to make French-speaking Switzerland a salient feature of this scripted-drama policy, we feel it is essential to engage with the international community. Having been invited last summer to a festival featuring TV series that are works in progress, Anomalia has already scored a bulls eye, thanks to the quality of its cinematography and acting and the originality of its subject matter. Many European professionals have already found the series moving, including international distributors, who have realised that TV producers in French-speaking Switzerland really know how to create original and high-quality series.

We are very proud to be able to offer this amazing series to the public. A series where reality meets dreams; a series that is both a fantasy series and a fantastic one, in the literal sense of the term, thanks to the talent assembled, both behind and in front of the camera, by our coproducing partner Point Prod – which, by the way, has produced other great scripted dramas in French-speaking Switzerland, including A Livre Ouvert and Port d'Attache, to name but a few.





Natacha Régnier

As a child, Natacha Régnier dreamed of being in the movies. She, her cousin and her sister enjoyed putting on mini-plays, and recreating Peau d'ane in the family home in Uccle, Belgium. Having attended a number of theatre courses in high school, Natacha enrolled at INSAS, from which she was expelled a year later, and was advised to "find a different career". But fortunately she did nothing of the sort, and in 1988 won the best actress award at Cannes for her portrayal of Marie in La vie rêvée des anges, directed by Eric Zonca. A year later, she won two other awards, including the most promising actress award at Cannes. A nuanced, rigorous, discrete, and tenacious actress with tremendous intellectual curiosity, Natacha stopped making films for a time in order to go on tour with the father of her first daughter, the composer Yann Tiersen, with whom she sings. Upon her return to films, Natacha acted in films by both first-time and established directors, and also appeared on the stage. All of her choices of roles have always been nothing if not daring. In 2015, she was in a series called Falco on TF1, and in the summer of that year, she shot a feature film directed by Eugène Green that also starred Mathieu Amalric.


Natacha's **role** in Anomalia: Valérie Rossier, a promising neurosurgeon, moves back to her native village with her son. The descendant of a long line of healers, it is through this return to her roots that she discovers her ability to heal her patients by rectifying their pasts. Her own past is inextricably bound up with an obscure legend about the village witch.



Didier Bezace

Didier Bezace comes from the world of the theatre. He studied acting at Centre universitaire de recherche dramatique (CUIFERD) in Nancy, under Maria Casarès and Bernard Dort, among others. As a member, until 1996, of the Théâtre de l'Aquarium acting company (which he co-founded), he was a playwright, director, and actor. From 1997 to 2013, he was artistic director of Théâtre de la Commune, where he directed L'école des femmes, which was performed on opening night at the 2001 Avignon Theatre Festival. In parallel with his successful career as a stage actor (winner of 4 Molières), Didier has also had a successful career as a movie and TV actor. He has made films with Claude Miller. Bertrand Tavernier. Jeanne Labrune, Anne Théron, Valérie Guignabodet, Claude Zidi, Rémi Bezançon, and Jean-Pierre Darroussin. Although he often takes on supporting roles, he is a remarkable and well-regarded actor – as his César for best actor in a supporting role for Profil bas in 1994 shows. Since making Anomalia, Didier has devoted most of his time to his own acting company, called L'Entêtement Amoureux. Until 2016, he appeared in Le Retour au désert. a play by Bernard-Marie Koltès. He will also be directing an adaptation of three plays by Feydeau.

Didier's **role** in Anomalia: Professor Wassermann, a prominent, influential, egocentric, and versatile neurosurgeon, is nearing retirement age – though he is loath to admit it. He was Valérie Rossier's mentor when she was a medical student, and has offered her a job in the hope that she will help him keep secret a medical condition whose revelation could disrupt the twilight years of his brilliant career.



Raphael Roger Levy

A born explorer and adventurer, Raphael spent much of his youth travelling all over the world. In 1992, at the tender age of 24, he moved to Tokyo's Minato district. It was here that he discovered his passion for martial arts, and karate in particular, which he practises at a competition level. Having spent a few years in London, Raphael moved to New York, where for four continuous years he studied acting at Actors Studio. His acting coaches there included Dustin Hoffman and Sigourney Weaver, among others. Raphael is currently appearing in a new series on Canal+called Versailles: 1667.

Raphael's **role** in Anomalia: Valérie's ex-husband, Nicolas. Despite their recent divorce and the fact that he keeps Valérie's new job at arm's length and takes a dim view of it, he is nonetheless there for her and helps her out with her new life as much as he can. He and Alex are bound to clash.



Isabelle Caillat

Born in New York and of Swiss and Haitian origin, Isabelle grew up in Geneva. As a child, she discovered theatre thanks to the courses she took with Claude Delon. Having realised that theatre is what makes her truly happy, she began dreaming of becoming an actress. A few years later, she moved to New York, where she did her professional training at Stella Adler Studio of Acting. There she learned about American movie and theatre culture, and worked on her body and voice. Upon returning to Europe, Isabelle's sweetness and tremendous sensitivity found their expression in theatre, movies, and television, under the direction of Jacob Berger, Elena Hazanov, Valentin Rotelli, and Pierre-Adrian Irlé, among others. She also received the Swiss Film Award's best-actress accolade ("Quartz") for All that Remains.

Isabelle's **role** in Anomalia: Iseult, Valérie's ancestor. A healer with tremendous powers and a connoisseur of medicinal plants, she fell victim to one of the last witch hunts and was drowned in the village well, which has since been drained.

Claude-Inga Barbey

Having become a radio comedian shortly after graduating from Ecole supérieure d'art dramatique de Genève acting school, Claude-Inga Barbey is also an actress and writer. For many years, she played the role of Monique alongside Monique's buddy Roger, played by her domestic partner Patrick Lapp. This was back in 1996, the first time that Bergamote was created – first for radio and then for the stage. The show continued until this year, at l'Orangerie, where Noces de carton, the epilogue of the famous story of this Swiss couple, was revived. Claude-Inga co-founded her own theatre company (with Doris Ittig) called La Compagnie Sans Scrupules, with which she has appeared in Les aventures de Betty, about a 45-year-old woman who is in therapy. The show was originally created for radio. Claude-Inga is a regular contributor to various daily newspapers in French-speaking Switzerland.

Claude-Inga's **role** in Anomalia: She plays Bénédicte, a nurse at the clinic who, like Josef, is a permanent fixture there. She embraces all belief systems and has built herself a little altar in the basement where she prays for her patients. She is the first person to firmly believe that Valérie has a gift and she encourages her to develop it.





Jean-Charles Simon

The face and voice of Jean-Charles Simon are well-known to audiences in French-speaking Switzerland. An actor and radio host, during a legislative period he also did a stint as a national adviser, along with his collaborator, the director Patrick Lapp. After graduating from high school, Jean-Charles decided to use his talents for the theatre. However, as he also held a degree in pharmacology, his professional career actually began with his work as a neighbourhood pharmacist. Yet his passion for theatre ultimately won out. Recently, in addition to his role in Boulevard Romand, he also appeared in Alexandre Astier's David et Madame Hansen, alongside Isabelle Adjani.

Jean-Charles's **role** in Anomalia: Jean-Charles plays Monsieur Déglise, a long-time neighbour and friend of Valérie's family. Although generosity and good-naturedness appear to describe his family perfectly, things that have gone unsaid in the past, and their repercussions in the present, will ultimately reveal a troubled family history.

Patrick Lapp

An indispensable figure in Swiss theatre, Patrick has acted in, and directed, numerous plays, most notably the Bergamote series starring Claude-Inga Barbey. Patrick has 40 years of radio broadcasting experience, during which he created, with his long-time collaborator Jean-Charles Simon, a programme entitled Aqua Concert on La Première, which presented classical music in a humorous and offbeat fashion (the show ended in 2012). On television, he is known for his role as grumpy Monsieur Bornant, who roamed through rows of library shelves in a series entitled A livre ouvert, directed by Stéphanie Chuat and Véronique Reymond. And as Patrick Lapp is a highly versatile artist, he has also appeared in the two most recent Lionel Baier films, Les grandes ondes and La vanité, which is currently in movie theatres.

Patrick's **role** in Anomalia: Josef, the clinic's grouchy concierge. A bit of a boozer with a weakness for gossip – passions that he shares with Bénédicte –, he is tremendously interested in stories about ghosts and witches, whom he stalks in the clinic's corridors.





Camille Figuereo

Camille studied acting at Ecole régionale d'acteurs de Cannes, in southern France, but now lives in Geneva, Switzerland. It is mainly in these two countries that she regularly appears in plays and films. She has had roles in plays directed by Omar Porras, Christian Rist, and Hervé Loichemol, and will soon be going on tour with a production of Dario Fo's, On ne paie pas !, On ne paie pas !, directed by Joan Mompart. As for films, Camille has appeared in L'Arnacoeur, directed by Pascal Chaumeil; Toutes nos envies, directed by Philippe Lioret, and last year, in Coup de chaud, directed by Raphael Jacoulot, alongside Gregory Gadebois and Jean-Pierre Darroussin. She has also appeared in Discipline, directed by Christophe M. Saber, which received the 2015 Swiss Film Award best short-film prize. Moreover, she is a regular member of the cast of Scènes de ménage, in which she plays Jeanne.

Camille's **role** in Anomalia: A childhood friend of Valérie's named Anne, who is thrilled that Valérie has moved back to the region. She is also Lucas's new teacher. Intrigued, but somewhat alarmed by the stories of witches in the village, she nonetheless has a hard time believing that the rational Valérie is susceptible to these kinds of hallucinations.

Baptiste Coustenoble

Having studied acting at Cours Florent, Baptiste enrolled at HETSR (Haute école de théâtre de Suisse romande, also known as Manufacture), an acting school located in Lausanne. He studied acting under Krystian Lupa, André Markowicz, and Pascal Rambert, among others. Since 2009, Baptiste has been a stage actor in Switzerland and France, where he has appeared in plays directed by Jean-Yves Ruf and Andrea Novicov, and in a Le Théâtre du Loup stage production. Although he appears in many plays, the current one being Home-Made by Magali Tosato at Théâtre de Vidy, Baptiste is also a film actor. He recently appeared in L'amour est un crime parfait, directed by the Larrieu brothers, and in Pause, directed by Mathieu Urfer. He has also appeared in Pierre-Adrian Irlé and Romain Graf's TV series called Station Horizon, on RTS.

Baptiste's **role** in Anomalia: Valérie's childhood friend, Alex. A devotee of spelaeology and a sociable, generous, and attractive man, he supports Valérie through the various surprises that her new life has in store for her. Despite the fact that he is a civil servant, which isn't exactly Valérie's type, their friendship soon becomes flirtatious.






Iannis Jaccoud

It wouldn't be far-fetched to say that lannis was predestined to become a movie actor. His mother is Isa Boucharlat, the costume designer; his father is a screenwriter and playwright; and his big brother, Antoine Jaccourd, is an animated-film voice actor and director. At the age of eleven, Iannis already felt at home in front of the camera, and was a sensitive and precise actor, endowed with a dynamism that enabled him to handle any situation with aplomb. In 2010, along with his brother Paulin, he made his first film appearance (opposite Michel Bouquet) in La petite chambre, directed by Stéphanie Chuat and Véronique Reymond. He was then cast in a smaller role in L'enfant d'en haut, directed by Ursula Meier, followed by a more substantial role in Déposer les enfants, directed by Bettina Oberli and Antoine Jaccoud. In 2014, he appeared in a mockumentary, La journée de mon frère, which was directed by his brother and which won an award at Vision du Réel.

lannis's **role** in Anomalia: Lucas, Valérie's son. Independent and a loner, Lucas is fearless – and the legends about the witch are certainly not going to deter him from exploring Josef's dressing room, which is a veritable trove of curiosities, or the forest, in search of medicinal plants to cure his friend Jacques.



Donovan Oberson

Donovan, who is thirteen years of age, already has considerable acting experience. The youngest of four children, his film-acting career began with his brothers and sisters, and thanks to his cousin Carmen Jaquier. Donovan and his brother Calvin were discovered, and then cast in Ursula Meier's L'enfant d'en haut, by virtue of Donovan having cast his siblings in his various short films and other projects at ECAL. Donovan developed a true passion for cinema in all of its many forms, and thus became a professional actor. He has been involved in various projects, while still getting excellent grades in school. Recently, he was the stand-in for the main character in Silence Mujo, directed by Ursula Meier.

Donovan's **role** in Anomalia: Jacques, a strange denizen of Clinique du Rosaire. Lucas meets him when he first arrives and becomes friends with him. Their shared fear of doctors prompts them to plot to get rid of the dangerous doctor who creates an atmosphere of fear at the clinic. But are they talking about the same era?
