

How the Romans Conquered the Alps

In 15 BC, Roman Emperor Augustus aimed to conquer Germania, but first, he had to secure the direct route north through the Alps. Despite its importance, little was known about this campaign until researchers uncovered an ancient battlefield – and the highest military camp of the Roman Empire – in the Swiss canton of Grisons.

A team of archaeologists worked with forensic and ballistics experts to reconstruct the campaign, revealing for the first time the route and the weapons used. A surprising discovery was the usage of lead sling-bullets to neutralise the enemy from a distance. The findings reveal how Roman soldiers overcame harsh mountain conditions in battle and in daily life. In a single summer, the


army annexed vast regions of the Alps that joined the new Raetia province, remaining part of the Roman Empire for 400 years.

Since humans first raised questioning eyes to the stars, each scientific discovery has unveiled new mysteries about the cosmos. *Into the Universe* delves into these astronomical enigmas, exploring the cycles that shape the sky, from the birth of spiral galaxies to the dramatic deaths of massive stars.

This series poses profound questions, such as whether the universe has a beginning and an end or if it is infinite. The answers may be found in the invisible forces that permeate 95% of space – dark energy and dark matter. Scientists use physics and quantum mechanics to solve these problems, but with phenomena such as black holes, their calculations don't always bring clarity. 

Dino Birds

How did birds become the most diverse group of vertebrates, thriving in nearly every habitat on Earth? For centuries, this question baffled palaeontologists. The discovery of the Jurassic Archaeopteryx fossil in the 19th century provided an early clue, but it wasn't until the late 20th century, when feathered dinosaurs were found in China, that their evolutionary story became clear – birds are the sole surviving descendants of dinosaurs.

Yet, one mystery remained – how did birds survive the asteroid that wiped out their giant cousins? In 2019, the

discovery of a 67-million-year-old fossil in a Cambridge lab shed light on this mystery. Recent excavations, such as those in Las Hoyas in Spain, have added insights into the evolution of birds, revealing how they survived the catastrophe and rapidly diversified during the Cretaceous period.

Mammals: Life before Dinosaurs

In 2023, palaeontologists Bruce Rubidge and Julien Benoit made a sensational discovery in South Africa's Karoo Basin. After 40 years of meticulous excavation, their team uncovered the oldest site of therapsids – the earliest known ancestors of mammals. In Pangaea, an unrecognisable world, where vast continents were joined as one, dinosaurs, mammals, birds, insects, and flowers had yet to

appear on Earth. How similar were these primeval animals to the diverse mammal family we know today? And how did they acquire the traits and behaviours that enabled mammals to conquer the world?

The palaeontological team meticulously reconstructs an ancient puzzle, unlocking the first chapter of the origins of complex life. Join them to explore the

groundbreaking discovery that reshapes our understanding of how mammals began their story.





Underground Odyssey: Gibraltar

Gibraltar has one of the highest concentrations of caves in the world, and more man-made tunnels than roads. In *Underground Odyssey: Gibraltar*, the team head to the monolithic rock on the edge of the Mediterranean to learn more about its underground labyrinth. Looking out to sea at Gorham's Cave, thousands of years of history have been uncovered, from Neanderthal skulls to ancient Greek offerings, with more secrets waiting to be revealed.

Was this the last outpost of Neanderthals in Europe? Did Gorham's Cave hold significance to the Greeks, being at the edge of their known world? Deep inside the rock, the team examines the Silent Pool which may hold never-before-seen creatures waiting to be discovered, as well as a network of strategic war tunnels carved into the limestone, including a secret WWII bunker long forgotten by the outside world.

Giant Caves: China

The South China Karst is one of the world's most spectacular examples of a subtropical karst land-scape – a terrain formed when water dissolves bedrock, creating caverns, sinkholes, and underground rivers. In this thrilling documentary, experts descend into Cloud Ladder Hall, a chamber so vast it has its own weather system. After several days camping and exploring, the team maps the entrances and exits to pinpoint how the air flows through the chamber, revealing how the cave's unique shape enables clouds to form inside it.

The documentary features endangered, cave-dwelling monkeys, fearless climbers seeking their next thrill, the deepest and most dramatic sinkholes on the planet, and an expedition to explore, illuminate, and photograph the Miao Room, at over 10 million cubic metres, the largest known cave chamber on Earth.

At the top of a planet shaped by its relationship to the sun, the beauty of the Arctic Circle often deflects from the reality of life in an inhospitable region. We spend 24 hours observing the creatures struggling to get through the day. From the Greenland shark, which can survive in waters of -7°C and live up to 500 years, to the bioluminescent sea pens that glow in the depths of the icy waters, and the iconic reindeer that have survived another winter, life here is extraordinary.

Climate change is heating the Arctic faster than anywhere on Earth, with dramatic consequences. The sea ice reflects the sun's rays, helping to balance our climate. The melting ice not only threatens the Arctic but also accelerates global warming. A stark reminder of the need to make changes in our lives, and to rewrite the story of climate change.

Mighty Monkeys

In Japan's Kamikochi Valley live monkeys unlike any other primate – the Japanese macaque. Known as the snow monkey, together these remarkable and adaptable creatures survive brutal winters and food-scarce summers. Each troop has its own food culture, passing knowledge through generations and adding new ideas when young males join the group.

As winter falls, they nibble on bark, roots, and bamboo – and sometimes even find insect larvae in rivers or seaweed along the coast. Summer turns the vegetation bitter and tough, forcing the macaques to travel for two months into the mountains, where a seasonal paradise of alpine fruits and pine cones awaits. The film captures not only their survival strategies in one of the planet's most unforgiving habitats but also their emotional

connections – a testament to their ingenuity, strength, and spirit.



Have You Ever Seen

Go beyond familiar wildlife to discover the obscure and overlooked creatures of the world. The hyrax, little-known cousins of the elephant, gather in large groups to warm themselves in the sun, while the endearing dik-dik antelopes mark their territory and communicate using secretions from scent glands located under their eyes. You have

probably never seen a fish as weird as the giant ocean sunfish, which can weigh up to 1,000 kg, and loves eating another strange species - the Portuguese man o' war jellyfish. We even take a look at unusual birds, such as the solitary shoebill, which uses its comical clog-shaped beak to catch fish and other prey.

Our world is full of biologically diverse creatures, each with their own role in

nature, and who add colour and curiosity to our planet. How many of them did you know already?



The Wild Side of Opposites

In a celebration of the diversity of our planet, we explore the wonders of creatures and habitats on opposing sides of the spectrum of life - from scorching deserts to icy mountain peaks, and dense jungles.

We discover an incredible variety of creatures in all shapes and sizes, from elephants that dominate the landscape to tiny shrews hiding among the leaves. Their diets are just as varied, ranging from adventurous to selective - with omnivorous bears happy to rummage through bins for a

snack, while picky koalas feed only on eucalyptus leaves. Even their mating behaviour reflects opposing life models from loyal albatrosses who bond for life to promiscuous crabs who prefer to trawl the waters for new partners. Across every habitat, species, and scale, we take a closer look at the extraordinary ways life adapts and survives.

Wild Mistakes


Whether it's a misstep, getting tangled in twigs, or falling from a tree, we all make mistakes – even animals. Some are just funny or embarrassing, but others can have dire consequences, leading to injury or death.

From the seal pup that gets out of its depth with a large male bull, to the stag that loses its footing in an embarrassing slip, much of fate is shaped by accidents. When we take a tumble, we often say 'we're only human', but perhaps that should be changed to 'we're only animals' – because we are all united by our wild mistakes.




