

Russia's Wars

When Russia takes up arms, the world holds its breath. Over centuries, the immense empire has been shaped by battles won – and lost – and those who led the forces that fought in them.

Peter the Great, founder of the magnificent St Petersburg, used guns and cannons to redraw the continent's maps. His descendants in the House of Romanov went from commanding the largest army in the world to defeat at the hands of the Bolsheviks. The newlyfounded Soviet Union withstood Hitler's murderous machine, only to inflict cruelty and terror on its own people. After the demise of the Soviet Union, Putin wages a cunning yet camouflaged campaign to revitalise Russian imperialism – if necessary, by force.

With unseen archive footage, insights from international experts, and visually stunning maps, this series tells the compelling story of a nation's fight to achieve its goals.

Ancient Apocalypse |S02

Every continent has its share of ruins. Places where crumbling stones tell the stories of fallen civilisations, whether they are buried under the earth, hidden in the shade of the jungle, or in the chaos of a lost city. Ancient Superstructures: Taj Mahal | S02

The Taj Mahal was built in the 17th century by the Mughal emperor Shah Jahan, in memory of his late wife. The extraordinary marble mausoleum was built in the city of Agra in northern India, and is considered one of the seven wonders of the modern world. And yet, there are so many things we still need to learn about the Taj Mahal and the surrounding architectural complex.

How did the builders complete it in just 20 years - when the Notre Dame cathedral took more than a century? What gives it stability, built as it is on the unstable banks of the sacred river Yamuna?

Using satellite images and microscopic investigations, historians, researchers, and engineers uncover the answers to these questions and more. The latest technology finds evidence of deep foundations, intricate gemstones, and innovative brick manufacture, and reveals the secrets at the heart of the colossal construction.

In one of the most consequential moments of the last century, on January 30, 1933, Adolf Hitler came to power in Germany. The three-part series *Hitler's Power* takes a closer look at the events leading up to this fateful day, and the terrible events that followed.

It also asks why the Nazi leader was confident of the approval of most Germans, even when it was clear the war was lost. Bison: An American Icon

Few things say 'Wild West' like the intimidating profile of a bison, an enduring icon of North American wilderness. Known locally as 'buffalo', bison played a key role in shaping the continent and the emerging United States of America. Yet, ironically, the powerful cattle were almost hunted out of existence by pioneers and settlers in the 19th century.

The Yellowstone National Park bison herd was down to just 23 of these shaggy beasts, but careful wildlife management has seen that number grow to around 5,000.

In *Bison: An American Icon*, we follow the life of a bison bull from the day of his birth, his endurance as a young calf, and his development into a strong bull who seeks victory in battle. In his story, we witness the indomitable spirit of a true survivor, and recognise the bison as a symbol that is inextricably linked to the American identity.

Extreme Namibia

Namibia is home to an abundance of Africa's magnificent wildlife, but the animals must adapt to the most extreme conditions. Over thousands of years, savannah elephants became desert elephants, and lions underwent a similar transformation. Forest animals, such as roe deer, red deer, foxes, and wild boar have become increasingly elusive due to generations of hunting. Occasionally, photographers or filmmakers might capture them from a distance during the mating season, but we lack insight into their behaviour when they are undisturbed. Innovative remote cameras provide an intriguing window into a new world.

This programme shows shy woodland animals in an intimacy that we know only from African wildlife shoots. Viewers will be entranced by the sight of dancing bears and hunting wolves in this stunning yet intimate wildlife portrait.

Little Cats – Big Personalities

Often overlooked in favour of their ferocious cousins, the felines at the smaller end of the scale can be just as impressive as lions and tigers. Known by scientists as felinae, the diverse small cat family has over 40 species, from the long-legged serval that roam sub-Saharan countries, to the lynx or bobcats with their tufted ears, and even the domestic and seemingly harmless kitten curled up on the sofa.

Despite their diversity, these small cats are united by several feline features. Their claws are retractable to keep them sharp, they have padded feet that enable a silent approach, their


pupils can contract in bright light and expand to provide night vision, and their ears can rotate independently like radars to home in on prey.

All these features have one single purpose: the hunt. Despite their size, these cats are impressive predators that gracefully, yet mercilessly, stalk their prey.

With distinct ecological systems, the North and the Baltic Seas are very different from the other oceans of the world. Wild Australia

A diverse and sometimes contradictory continent, Australia is filled with natural wonders. This five-part series takes viewers from the desert around Uluru to the dramatic southern plains, from the impenetrable jungles in the northeast of the country to the eucalyptus forests in eastern Australia. In each episode, we discover the wildlife that has adapted to thrive even in extreme conditions. The mighty kangaroos in the fiery heart of the country, the quirky wombats living underground, snappy crocodiles in the swamps – and we discover that the koalas aren't quite as cuddly as we've been led to believe.

Renowned wildlife filmmakers Thoralf Grospitz and Jens Westphalen travelled endless kilometres through the outback, using specialised macro and super slow motion HD cameras to portray the animal kingdom as you've never seen it before. This is a visually stunning portrait of wild Australia.

The Chagos Islands – Hope for Coral Reefs?

In the middle of the Indian Ocean, more than 1,500 km from the nearest landmass, lies an untouched mysterious archipelago the Chagos Islands. This group of 60 islands is one of the last pristine wildernesses on Earth. As one of the world's biggest marine national parks, the Chagos Archipelago is strictly protected, but for the first time, a scientific expedition has been granted access to the politically disputed territory.

In times of climate change, as coral reef communities face a global crisis, the researchers seek to show how coral reefs fare in places of minimal human influence.



Rescued Chimpanzees of the Congo with Jane Goodall S02

Filmed over a year on location at Dr. Jane Goodall's chimpanzee sanctuary in the Republic of Congo, this is the moving story of one of the most ambitious and scientifically rigorous wilderness reintroduction programmes ever attempted. A group of orphaned chimpanzees is being prepared for reintroduction into the wilderness. It's a challenging prospect, as the chimps have no experience of living in the forest, and no perception of the dangers lurking there. With unprecedented access to the sanctuary, we follow the chimps as they bond to become a strong, cohesive group. Their fascinating journey is interwoven with innovative scientific research, interviews with experts, including Dr. Goodall, and set against the backdrop of everyday life at the sanctuary.

The second season of this popular show presents more heartwarming stories of chimps, their animal friends, and the dedicated staff preparing them for their challenging new adventure.
